**Nandalal Ghosh B T College** was established in the year 1968 by some of the dedicated people of North 24 Parganas, to help the untrained teachers at the nearby schools of Naihati, Kankinara and other nearby schools and the aspirant students of North 24 Parganas. For this welfare cause of the society Late Amar Ghosh donated their ancestral two storied building in Panpur village having 16 rooms and a small temple (Mandira) of Lord Lakshmi Janardhan and some open land for the college and on his request the college was named by the name of his father Late Nandalal Ghosh as "Nandalal Ghosh B.T. College". All the land donated by Late Amar Ghosh was in the name of Thakur Lakshmi Janardhan, the worshipped deity of the community people and the college. Though the college was taken up by the Govt. of West Bengal, the traditional puja of the deity is still going on in the same building as a matter mentioned in the deed. It also served for the integration of community people with the inmates of the college for their deep faith and belief on the deity. At the initial stage, the college was running in Madral, Naihati and the building was used for the Hostel purpose. In the year 2002 the college was shifted from Madral to its present location at Panpur, Narayanpur, North 24 Parganas.



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On completion of all the formalities, the college started functioning in the year 1968 under the affiliation of University of Calcutta. With the order of the Govt. of West Bengal the affiliation of the college shifted from Calcutta University to West Bengal State University (WBSU), Barasat in the year 2008 and from WBSU to West Bengal University of Teachers Training, Education Planning and Administration (WBUTTEPA) in 2016. Presently the name WBUTTEPA has been changed as Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University (BSAEU), Kolkata. And now the college is continuing under the affiliation of the BSAEU and recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE).

Regarding administration of the college, it was under the policy of Administrator till the constitution of the first Governing Body in 2014. Now the college, for its management, has got its full-fledged Governing Body.

Now the college has three buildings having sufficient rooms, laboratories, Library, playground and open lands. Initially the college offered training course for one year B.Ed. for 100 students, but now with the new regulation of NCTE 2014 the college is offering two-year B.Ed. training programme for one basic unit of 50 students per year. It abides by the rules, regulations and guidelines of its affiliating University BSAEU (Erstwhile WBUTTEPA), UGC, NCTE, Govt. of India and Govt. of West Bengal,

Regarding its yearly curricular and co-curricular activities, the college regularly organized different activities like Lecture series, seminars, workshops, orientation programmes, community outreach programmes, field visits, study tours, Observation of National Days and festivals apart from Orientation programmes in Yoga and Creative Arts Practices from time to time

### General Rules and Regulations of Admission for B.Ed. Course:

. The General Rules and Regulations of B.Ed. Programme are:

1. The Duration of the B.Ed. programme is Two Academic Years covered with four Semesters (Semester-I, II, III & IV). The maximum duration to complete the course may be taken up to a maximum of three years from the date of admission.
2. The medium of instruction will be both in English and Bengali.
3. The total number of seats will be 50 /one unit and distributed as 5% seats for in-service candidates (deputed) and 95% seats for fresh candidates (fresher).

No of seat for Deputed candidates: 03



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No. of seat for Fresher candidates: 47

In case of seat/s not filled up by the deputed candidate/s, those will be allotted to fresher candidate/s.

4. The admission process will follow the West Bengal reservation policy as SC-22%, ST - 6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7% and PH 3%

In case any seat/s lying vacant for any reserved category, that will be offered to the other category candidates in the merit list with the permission of the BCWB.

### **Eligibility for Admission to B.Ed. Course:**

- Candidates should be a graduate in a school subject from a recognized University.
- The candidate must have at least 50% marks in the bachelor's degree (General)/ in the master's degree in School Subjects.
- Bachelor's in engineering or technology with Science or Mathematics with 55% marks or any other Degree equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission for the B.Ed. Programme. Such candidates are required to enter the marks of B.E. /B.Tech. in the row of Honours Degree. The M.E./ M.Tech. result will be entered in master's degree row.
- The Honours Graduates in the school subjects should enter the Honours marks only in the Bachelor's Degree (Honours).
- In case of General Graduates, the total marks obtained in general subjects should be entered in the Bachelor's degree (general).
- For candidates with less than 50% marks in the Honours degree, the total marks of pass and honours subjects will be considered. If it becomes 50% or more, that score will be entered in Graduation (general) row.
- For fresh candidates, the merit list will be prepared separately for each school subject based on Scoring.
- For Deputed candidates, the merit list will be prepared separately for each school subject based on their score **and the length of their past service.**

2. For scoring in HS, the marks obtained in best five subjects excluding Environmental Studies will be considered.
3. Candidates applying with CGPA/SGPA scores must submit supporting documents in respect of conversion from CGPA/SGPA score to percentage of marks from appropriate authority at the time of admission, in case the formula is not mentioned in their marksheets.

### For Deputed Candidates

Applicants deputed by School must submit/ upload an attested copy of M.C. resolution recording the approval of Service in regard to his/her service with the Application Form.

Following additional documents are required to be submitted positively on the day of verification of documents in the College along with all certificates, mark sheets and other testimonials



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1. Attested copy of M.C. resolution with regard to his/her deputation, countersigned by D. I. of Schools (Secondary).
2. Certificate from the Competent Authority whether the candidate teaches in Class IX or above.
3. Three copies of Coloured Passport size photographs of the applicant.
4. A certificate with the following information is to be submitted from the Secretary or Headmaster/Headmistress (where he/she is serving) and counter signed by the D.I. of Schools of the District concerned:
  - Certified that the School is in receipt of aid on full/ deficit/ lump sum grant basis or that the school in unaided or salary deficit scheme .
  - Certified that she/he is duly approved teacher.
  - Certified that she/he is being deputed by the school for undergoing two year B.Ed. Courses
  - Release order (Original) from the school will be submitted on the day of Joining to the B.Ed. Course.

**N.B.:** The rules and fees of Online B.Ed. admission may be changed as per guidelines of Affiliating University and Recognized Authority. Final Notification will be given at the commencement of Online Admission every Year
